

Upcoming Local Law changes for residents household, hard rubbish and public waste bins

It's important to stay informed about the new Community Local Law 2024-2034 and understand how it will impact you.



Understanding the new Community Local Law

The Community Local Law 2024 is designed to balance safety, personal freedom, and community responsibility, ensuring the City of Whittlesea remains a welcoming 'A *Place For All*'. It covers a wide range of areas including rubbish bins, animals, and the upkeep of public spaces to enhance community safety and neighbourhood amenities.

Important changes for residents

- **Right thing, right bin:** choose the right bin for rubbish and don't contaminate household bins.
- Looking after your bins: don't overfill, damage or destroy household bins.
- **Collection day:** put your bins out before 6am on collection day and remove them the same day.
- Hard rubbish: check Council's instructions for hard rubbish collection.
- Not your hard rubbish: don't add, remove or interfere with other people's hard rubbish.
- **Bin it at home:** dispose of household rubbish and recycling in your household bins, not public waste bins.

What this means for you

- **Plan ahead:** understand how the new Local Laws affect you to ensure compliance by the 1 July 2024 deadline.
- **Community responsibility:** these changes were driven by community feedback and aim to improve safety, protect public spaces, and enhance the quality of our neighbourhoods.
